Antibiotic prophylaxis is not recommended for a 1<sup>st</sup> UTI but may still help in complex urological conditions.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>b</sup> In event of recurrent UTI consideration should be made as to whether a repeat ultrasound is truly warranted and reviewing previous imaging investigations eg. DMSA and MCUG is recommended.
